

I take immense pleasure in conveying my hearty congratulations to the Goodwill Christian College for Women as another edition of the college e-magazine goes online.



The year 2023 -2024 was an exciting year filled with the convergence of Academic and Co-curricular activities. Through it all, we have always moved forward with our mission of empowering young women and vision of providing value based holistic education. Some of the highlights of the year were;

Staff Orientation :

As always, the academic year commenced with an orientation programme for the staff on 25th November 2023 with the prime focus on work -life balance. Rev. Ruth Rekha Michael, Member, Executive Committee, Board of Management, Presbyterian In-charge CSI Shantha Oliver Church and CSI Sawday Memorial Church was the resource speaker.

Student orientation:

The onset of a new academic year for the first year students began with an orientation programme organized for the benefit of the students who are about to experience a new phase in life. The Fresher's were acquainted by the Principal about the Vision, Mission and Motto of the institution, the rules and regulations to be followed, semester scheme, Internal Assessment .They were also made aware of the New Education Policy and its aims and objectives.

Results:

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

The interaction of microorganisms with plants plays a crucial role in various aspects of plant growth, health, and survival. To give an insight on this the students were taken on a botanical trip to Lalbagh Garden.



The department of Microbiology, used World Aids Day as an occasion to show solidarity with the millions of people living with HIV worldwide by creating awareness on the day. The department conducted competitions like debate and other events to sensitize the students about this issue.



Mini Project: Projects are an essential part of any educational program, providing students with hands-on experience in their chosen field. The students of Microbiology department pursued an internship in Microbiology (Bacteriology & Serology) similar to the Laboratory Technician course at CSI Hospital.

DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The Department of Botany aims at offering an understanding of Plant Sciences. To fulfill this aim, the department organized a guest lecture to keep students up to date with the latest in plant science. The students were also taken on a field trip to Lalbagh Botanical Garden that has an extensive collection of over 1,800 species of plants, including exotic trees, colourful flowers and medicinal herbs. The students gained immense practical knowledge and exposure to a wide variety of flora.



DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY

Movie Time: The Chemistry department organized an enriching movie visit to watch “Oppenheimer,” a biographical documentary about J. Robert Oppenheimer's journey with the atomic bomb on 8th August 2023 for the science students. Our teachers and student faculty accompanied us on this educational outing.



The Art of Soap Making: On 7th June, the Department of Chemistry conducted a project on making organic soaps for the I B.Sc students under the supervision of Dr. Cynthia E Theodore. The students had a great experience making different organic soaps, adding many essential oils and fragrances which gave them unique properties suiting different types of skins.



Mini Project - Preparation of Potash Alum from Aluminium Foil:

On 28th June 2024, the Department of Chemistry performed a mini project for the final year III BSc students on the preparation of potash alum from aluminium foil under the supervision of Prof. Cynthia E Theodore. This innovative project showcased the versatility of everyday materials. The main aim was to purify water using potash alum which could be formed from easily available aluminium foil.



Guest Lecture - Aromatic Nucleophilic Substitution Reactions:

The Department of Chemistry, under the guidance of Mrs. Cynthia Theodore (HOD), conducted a guest lecture on June 21st, 2024. The lecture was delivered by Miss Saliha Saman G, a subject matter expert working at Vaidik Edilservice Pvt Ltd in Noida. She is also an alumna of Goodwill Christian College for Women.



Mini Project Lipstick Making for II year B.SC Students:

The Department of Chemistry performed a mini project for the II B.Sc students with the objective on making lipstick from natural products. The formulation of lipstick involves a blend of various chemicals, each contributing to the product's colour, texture, stability, and wearability.



DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

A one day workshop was organised by the Department of Commerce and the college Placement Cell on 30th May 2024. This was a personality development and confidence building workshop conducted by Team Right Side Story in collaboration with Whisper and Gillette India Ltd..

The resource person was Ms. Tanya K. and co-ordinator Mr. Kshitij Tripathi. It was attended by 300 students from commerce and other streams.

The main objective was to familiarize students with the emerging ideas and trends on BYOS-Be Your Self. The session enhanced the confidence of students and sharpened their communication and inter personal skills .

It was an activity based session to enrich academic language, effective time management and self evaluation to achieve personal and professional goals. E- Certificates were given to the participants.



DEPARTMENT OF BBA

In collaboration with IQAC and Centum Foundation, an “EMPLOYABILITY SKILLS ENHANCEMENT TRAINING PROGRAMME” was conducted for the Final Year students of BBA Department starting from December 14th 2023. Ms. Amira was the resource speaker. The training program was organized with the objective of training the students on soft skills which include Problem solving skills, Business communication, Leadership skills and Business Etiquettes. The entire program consisted of 50 hours.

The sessions were well-structured and well-executed through PowerPoint presentations consisting of various images, charts and videos. They also introduced us to the Centum Foundation app which provides us with many modules and assessments which include Customer Relationship Management, People Management, Finance Management and many more. The students can access reading material, audio, video and many surveys. On completion of every module and taking up on line tests the students are given certificates.

A one day seminar was organised on 18th June 2024 . The speaker for the day was Mr. Karthik a software engineer as well as a trainer from Alpatech Academy. He has a total of 18 years of experience in the IT industry and also trains students and professionals on the latest software technologies.




EVENT REPORTS

" Compassionate Adversaries "

I would be there in a minute, I replied , and hung up the phone . Hurriedly got down the stairs and into the cab, I was on my way home . Extremely exhausted and my inner reserves were depleted , nor was I glowing like I did in the morning , bright by the day light . As I rolled down the window for some cool breeze , a medley of voices resonated in the air , city dwellers were making their way back , vendors screaming , vehicles honking like performing a live orchestra, and a group of youngsters fighting . People nowadays have become so volatile. They have such little tolerance that even a trivial matter is enough to ignite their temper.

I wonder how do people find it impossible in their day - to - day jobs not to practice compassion . Do they need to motivate themselves for something that's so well tunned within their system .. Isn't it true that every person is born with a gene for compassion, an innnate , intrinsic , inherent gene , a human trait either you have it or you don't. I would like to quote " Those who lack compassion should be considered similar to people suffering from genetic disorder ,or a chromosomal abnormality, or even a missing attribute in the genotype" , unquote .

To have written the above down has a body of my letter , still pondering over the issue of uncompassionate people around me. My mind seems to be clogged by troubled thoughts leaving my head to ache . Pushing my chair back I get up on my feet which felt dead sitting for long hours , limpping with discomfort I pause for a moment , and then with a steady stance walk up and slide the glass door to find the dark sky lit up with stars and lo ! the moon came passing by too . The kettle beeped as the aroma of freshly brewed coffee filled my senses. I picked my cup and stood all alone in the dark solitude of my backyard, sipping hot coffee and looking at the distant panorama of lights , I listened as the crickets sang with lusty joyful abadon .. I couldn't help looking at everything and saying as God did, " It is good , " Only that my voice had a touch of wonder in it , while HIS had satisfaction. But five just such unexpected minutes all by myself gives me 'MY TIME ' to introspect , " Are relationships worth a whole lifetime of chasing " .

I was still left with the bitter taste like feeling after what happened today at work ,an interpersonal conflict with a colleague can be pretty stressful . An experience like that can often leave me either becoming defensive or often times I simply berate myself . . within no time I seemed to be engulfed by a feeling of being abandoned , orphaned, unheard and insignificant.
