It is indeed a great pleasure to present the Annual Report for the year 2024 -2025. The year 2024 -2025 was an inspiring year filled with a blend of Academic and Co-curricular activities. Through it all, we have always moved forward with our mission of empowering young women and vision of providing value based holistic education. Some of the highlights of the year were;

STAFF ORIENTATION :

As always, the academic year commenced with an orientation programme for the staff on 14th September 2024. Rev. Ruth Rekha Michael , Member , Executive Committee and Assistant Presbyter In-charge St.Marks church and Presbyter In-Charge Wesleyan Centenary Kannada Devalaya, Halasuru was the resource speaker. The inspiring session was followed by a brief talk on unity, leadership and fellowship by Mrs.Christine , Pastoral Committee Member – St. Marks Church and Member of Board of Management of Cathedral School. 
Group discussions, role-playing, pechakucha presentations, extempore, brochure creation, and other classroom activities were all part of the department's SEP and NEP General English curriculum.

The tour, spanning from 8:45 AM to 2:00 PM, provided a comprehensive overview of the institute's facilities, research, and patient care. We explored the serene campus, witnessing the unique pavilion structures and tranquil gardens designed to foster healing. We gained insights into the history of psychiatry in India, visiting the Psychiatric Block, which was inaugurated in 1954. The Centre for Brain and Mind, dedicated to groundbreaking-research in neuroscience, left us in awe. The Department of Integrative Medicine showcased the harmonious blend of ancient yoga practices and modern psychiatry. We also visited specialized wards, the Centre for Addiction Medicine, and the Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services, which offer comprehensive care for individuals with mental health challenges. The tour concluded with visits to the OPD Block, the Heritage Museum, the Dr. M.V. Govindaswamy Centre, the Behavioral Medicine Unit, the Child and Adolescent Psychiatry department, and the Neurocenter. This enriching experience provided a deeper understanding of mental health, the challenges faced by patients, and the innovative approaches employed by NIMHANS to address them.



DEPARTMENT OF JOURNALISM

Journalism students of BA Department were taken to a newly inaugurated Traffic Police Museum located at Infantry road, Bangalore which showcases the history and evolution of traffic management in the city, including vintage equipment, historic photographs, and interactive displays on road safety.

As a part of the topic society reporting, students were made to experience this. Here they got to learn how traffic controlling division was established in Bangalore city, different set of uniforms from the initial days what police men wore, different types of walkie talkie, and an app called BTP astram which has unique features to help public to commute hassle free.


DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

PEARL ACADEMY WORKSHOP


PEARL Academy Workshop on Study Majors and Career Paths in Psychology
